Community Planning Council - Nominating for 2017-2018 is underway. The March CPC meeting focused on Access to Health Care, featuring staff from the Greenwich Hospital Clinic and Family Centers, which recently opened a Federally Qualified Health Center at Wilber Peck Court.

Reading Champions - To date, 137 Reading Champions volunteers have serviced 441 students. Graduations are scheduled for the entire month of May. Our annual tea will be held to honor our volunteers and school literacy specialists on June 8th at The Woman's Club of Greenwich from 10am-noon. Keynote speaker will be Diane Garrett of Diane's Books in Greenwich. Volunteers are needed for next year.

GJrUW - Two meetings were held in the month of March. It was decided to meet weekly (Wednesdays at 6:30pm) to build momentum and consistency. Currently, four out of the nine attending members have taken on leadership roles within GJrUW and we are working on The Undies Project as our end of the year community service project (KIC, N2N are beneficiaries).

Youth Planning Council -The March meeting featured a panel of youth service providers who discussed programs designed to teach positive relationships and respectful behavior.
