



**CEO Board Report

Andrew Barer, Director of Development for Pacific House (a G UW funded shelter for homeless men), stopped by recently to thank us for our funding and to give me an update on a homeless teen from Greenwich named Gabe. Gabe's situation has led Pacific House to offer shelter dedicated to "young adults" in separate living quarters from the older residents. Partially due to the funding of the G UW, Pacific House now can offer safer, age appropriate shelter to teens to give them the best chance to succeed. I asked Andrew for an update on Gabe. Andrew said he graduated from GHS and is now enrolled and doing very well at Missouri Western State University. Gabe is studying criminal justice. He wants to be a police officer.

I am so honored to be part of a story like this. This is why I took the job.

 - Hosted CEO Roundtable 10/5. Nine CEO's in attendance. Guests were state reps Scott Frantz, Mike Bocchino and Fred Camillo. Discussed state budget impasse and its effect on NFP funding, etc.
 - I was proud to be in attendance on 9/27 when Jill Weiner and Laura Geffs received YWCA *Spirit Awards* for their volunteerism in our community. Their contributions to G UW were highlighted in their remarks.
