Meeting called to order by Eileen Kim, Board Chair at 6:02pm.

Eileen welcome Board staff to the virtual meeting.

Approval of Minutes – William Finger, Secretary

Bill made a motion to approve minutes with amendment to include the CPC motion language. 2nd by Debra Hess. The motion passed unanimously.

CEO Report – David Rabin, CEO

The full report available for review on the G UW board portal.

- Scholarship process: State of CT requires parent to enroll children in pre-school program. G UW has awarded \$200K to early childhood providers to offer student scholarships. We are shifting the process to allow parents to apply directly for assistance. It has been difficult to conclude from grant reporting how scholarship dollars are being spent benefiting families. It is possible that scholarship recipients can be turned down to enroll full-paying students. We will continue to provide grant support to Family Centers.

Open discussion followed. The consensus was to move forward with further discussion among the Director Impact Programs Committee.

Finance – Debra Hess, Vice Chair

Eva Maria Janerus reports for Audit Committee. Audited financial statements were received on October 26, 2020. The Joint Audit and Finance Committees are ahead of schedule compared to prior years. and are hopeful to share draft financials in advance of the November 2020 Board



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Meeting. Please review once received and share questions in advance to Eva Maria or Debra Hess to reach resolution during the next Board meeting.

Eileen Kim noted that audit and financial review is one of the most important functions of the Board.

Community Impact – Nicole Kwasniewski, Vice Chair

Jeremy Nappi provided an update regarding the Needs Assessment. It is on track to be rolled out in January 2021. Fairfield University is conducting the final analysis and 2nd round of interviews. Dashboard drafts are expected within the next few weeks.
